#### Academic education for nurses

The Grameen Caledonian College of Nursing offers a three-year course leading to a Diploma in Nursing and Midwifery Studies. In future there will be the opportunity for students to work to Bachelor, Masters and Doctoral level as the research facilities of the College develop.

The nursing qualifications of the College are recognised by the Bangladesh Nursing Council and, following the successful completion of the BNC licensing and certification exam, you can register with them and be licensed to work as a nurse-midwife.

#### Course details

The college year is divided into two semesters. The first semester is from January to June and the second from July to December. For the Diploma in Nursing and Midwifery Studies you will study for three years, and the details of the six semesters are listed on right.


## How to apply


If you would like to join us, check that you have the minimum qualifications required. All students will be selected on academic and personal merit alone.

- You must be the daughter of a Grameen Bank borrower
- You must be single
- You must have passed both SSC and HSC Examinations in Science/ Humanities/Commerce (but Science is preferred); English GPA 3; Cumulative GPA (in SSC and HSC) totals of 6.00 and not less than GPA 2.25 in either SSC or HSC
- You must apply within three years of passing your HSC examination
- You must have a good understanding of English
- You must be medically fit.
